## **Turning Over a New Leaf**

Dear Friends,

We are now beginning the second month of 2018. Time is flying by.

February 14, 2018 we begin our Lenten journey leading to Easter on April 1, 2018. Easter this year (Easter any year) is NO April fools joke.



The Church and we as individuals are being transformed by God's Grace. Many people do not like to change but we are called to follow Jesus which requires a change or transformation. Many people are afraid of change (transformation) because of the unknown. God continues to challenge us to be changed (transformed) so we can learn to Trust God and not fear.

The most potent antidote to fear is our faith in God. Scottish writer Ralph Turnbull years ago told a harrowing story that took place during World War I.

After the Armistice of 1918, a destroyer carried the British prime minister, Lloyd George, from France to England. The weather during that crossing was frightful, and when they reached Dover the conditions were so bad, even in the harbor, that they could not get alongside the docks. So they sent for a small motorboat called a launch to carry the Prime Minister to the shore. The only problem was how to get him from the destroyer to the launch. The destroyer was rolling alarmingly, and there was a danger of having him fall into the sea.

What they did was to station five men on the launch. The prime minister was led to the gangway, and the officer in charge told him that at the word "Go" he was to step forward and release his hold. So he waited. The ship rolled down the next swell until the upper edge of the side of the boat was almost submerged.

When the ship had reached the limit of her roll, the officer shouted, "Go!" and the prime minister stepped forward and let go. He fell directly into the small boat below and was caught as neatly and as surely as if he were a baseball in a centerfielder's hand. He was safe because he trusted the officer's word.

I can't imagine a more perfect picture of faith than that. It means letting go and trusting ourselves completely to the promises of God.

Paradise United Methodist Church has been in a constant change the 3 ½ years I've been here. Key people have died. Others have moved closer to be near family, new people have joined us bringing their ideas, the facility requires on going maintenance, and our world is different. Yet, God continues to keep us relevant, if we will listen and change, reaching out to people of Paradise and the world.

Dr. E. Stanley Jones, one of the great Christians of the twentieth century, put it like this: "I see that I am inwardly fashioned for faith and not for fear. Fear is not my native land, faith is. I am so made that worry and anxiety are sand in the machinery of life. Faith is oil. I live better by faith and confidence than by fear and doubt and anxiety. In anxiety and worry my being is gasping for breath. These are not my native air . . . We do not know why it is that worriers die sooner than non-worriers. But that is a fact. But I who am simple of mind think I know," writes E. Stanley Jones. "We are inwardly constructed in nerve and tissue and brain cell and soul for faith and not fear. God made us that way. To live by worry is to live against reality."

Paradise United Methodist Church needs to change, do not fear. We need to increase our financial giving, enabling us to pay our apportionments. We need to increase membership, young and old. We need to increase educational opportunities, people willing to teach. We need more people willing to reach out to people hurting. How can you help with these opportunities? Are you listening? DO NOT FEAR! Step forward and accept the challenge.

Take time this lenten season for God. Listening to what God would have you do and become. Then proceed by trusting, believing, and having an Active Faith in God allowing yourself to be transformed, transforming the world.



### 2018 Pledge Campaign Outcome

Tax-deductible contributions to the Wood-Kerr Scholarship Fund are welcome, and can be given as memorial gifts or as general gifts. *Contributions cannot be given with specific award recipient specifications* (this would jeopardize our tax-exempt status).

#### **Scholarship Criteria**:

Upper division college or graduate student (with a minimum of two years of college work completed) with an established major field of study

Overall college GPA of 3.0 or higher

#### Additional information:

Renewal scholarships are available to past scholarship recipients provided the above criteria are still met

Membership and/or active participation at Paradise United Methodist Church is *encouraged* but *not required* 

The committee awards scholarships once each year, in amounts ranging from \$250 to \$1,000, and is now accepting applications for the school year 2018-19. **The deadline for new applications is March 25**; for renewal scholarships, April 15. Scholarship recipients will be selected by May 1.

## Lunch Bunch

Lunch Bunch this month will take place on Wednesday, February 28th. As always, we'll have lunch in Charter Hall promptly at Noon, follow with our speaker, and finish around 1:30. \$5.00 to pay for the meal is requested; just drop your money in the basket as you arrive. If you bring your own plates and utensils, it makes things easier for the kitchen. But that's not required.

The Menu: Sliced Ham, Sweet and Sour Beans, Buttered Carrots, Coleslaw, and (yum) Apple Strudel.

Our presenter is someone that several of you know: Georgie Summers. Georgie's husband was pastor at PUMC from 1974 to 1983. She'll be talking about Single-payer Insurance. Single-payer national health insurance is a system in which a single public or quasi-public agency organizes health care financing. (Alternatively, a multi-payer healthcare system is one in which private individuals or their employers pay for health insurance with various limits on healthcare coverage via multiple private or public sources.) Georgie isn't selling anything; she'll just be giving us information. There has been so much discussion about what health care system is the best and a lot of confusion about different options. Georgie's talk should help us understand this option.

Looking further ahead: March's Lunch Bunch.

The date will be March 28. Our program will be about Personal Medical Alert Systems. You've all seen the commercials. "Help, I've fallen and I can't get up."

There are many medical alert options on the market. Our Feather River Hospital offers the LifeLine Medical Alert System. Our speaker will be a hospital volunteer who works with LifeLine. However, this won't be a sales presentation so much as information about what these systems offer in the way of security and safety. There are people in our community who would benefit from having a personal alert system, but they don't know enough about them to understand the options in service and pricing. Too many folks wait until they fall and wind up in the hospital; then they decide to get a unit.

Personal alert systems are worn or carried in a pocket or purse so the alert button is always accessible. Many alert companies offer services far beyond the "I've fallen" aspect. Immediate access to medical advice, call a family member or neighbor to come to your aid, send an ambulance to you, an alert that will go out if you are unconscious and can't push your alert button. These alert systems save lives and also help make individuals, families, and friends feel more secure.
